University of Rochester, July 31, 1862.*

AT a Special Meeting of this Chapter, held this day, pursuant to call, the following preamble and resolutions were unanimously adopted :

WHEREAS, It has pleased Almighty God to remove from the Upsilon Chapter, our much loved Brother, Lieutenant JOSEPH WEBSTER, who fell mortally wounded on the battle field before Richmond, June 27th, 1862, the first martyr of this Chapter to the cause of our National Integrity—therefore

Resolved, That, in the death of Bro. WEBSTER, this Chapter has lost one of its most loved and honored members, whose generous disposition and manly character have won our esteem, and will secure for him an enduring place in the memories of our College life.

Resolved, That, participating as we do in their deep affliction, we tender our heartfelt sympathies to his relatives and friends ; rejoicing that with this bereavement is mingled the consolation that he died in a noble cause, struggling on for his country's preservation, ever conspicuous alike for his ardent patriotism, his self-sacrificing valor, and above all, for his eminent Christian zeal.

Resolved, That, in memory of our deceased Brother, the badges of this Chapter be draped, and so worn for thirty days.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be sent to the relatives of the deceased, to the daily papers of this city for publication, and to the other Chapters of the Fraternity.
