On this 28th Day of January
1865 before me a Notary Public in and for said
County and State, personally appeared before Albert W
George true well known and aged twenty six years
who being first duly sworn according to law declares
that he is not indebted to the United States on any
account whatever; and he further declares that he is
the identical Albert W George who was a First
Lieutenant in Company "G" of the 100th Regt of Ohio
Volunteer Infantry, which was commanded by Col.
Albert H. Hall; that he was mustered into the
service of the United States on the eleventh (11th) Day
of July A.D. 1862, at Columbus Ohio by Capt.
Albert B. Dod U.S.A. Pursuant to the order and
Appointment of His Excellency David Tod Governor
of the State of Ohio; that he resigned on the 6th
Day of December A.D. 1863; that the condition of said
Appointment and Muster as shown by the Appointment
which is forwarded herewith was that the said George in
connection with the other Officers of the Company should
be allowed thirty days (from the date of Appointment) to
recruit a Company, and if the requisite number of men
were raised in that time, he should draw full pay from the date
of the Muster-in (See Conditions 3^d and 4th of Appointment)
What this condition was complied with upon his part; that
before the expiration of thirty days from the date of his Muster-in
viz: on the 8th Day of August following, there was signed
upon the rolls of the Company to which he was assigned
"G" 100th Regt, one hundred and one (101) men
who were afterwards viz: upon the 20th Day of said month 2^d
arrived, accepted and mustered into the service of the
United States; that more than forty (40) of the

men were enlisted by the Appraiser himself or some
other person who were at that time (August 25th 1862)
transferred to Company "A" of 2nd Regiment; for
verification of which facts he would respectfully refer to the
original muster rolls of the ^{said} Companies on file in the office of
the Adjutant General of the U.S. Army in the City of
Washington D.C. And the declarant further states that
he was first paid on the 16th day of May A.D. 1863
at Columbus Miss, from the 5th day of August 6th
1862 to the 31st day of October 1862, by Maj. Genl.
Sherman Paymaster, U.S.A.; that he ^{should have received} received the money
~~pay from the 5th day of July~~ ^{pay from the 5th day of July} ~~and reported to him~~ according to the terms of his ap-
pointment and the condition of this muster-in; that he re-
fused to sign the receipt for pay in full to October 31st 1862
but did receive pay from August 5th to Oct 31st, and
that the receipt certificate of said paymaster is forward-
ed herewith. The said Appraiser further states that
he has never received any pay or compensation from
any source whatever for the trouble labor and expense
incurred by him the said Appraiser in procuring the
enlistment of recruits for the Armies of the United
States, during the interval between the date of his muster-in
July 11th 62 and August 5th 62; and he did this from
the belief and consideration that the conditions of the Appraiser's
would be fulfilled by the Government of the United States as
therein set forth and he further says that he has upon
his part performed all the conditions of the contract contained
and set forth therein and that he therefore believes that
he is entitled to the pay of a first Lieutenant of Infantry
and allowances as such, from the 11th day of
July to the 5th day of August 1862 (twenty five
days @ 25) and that there is due him from the
Government of United States the sum of \$7.75

The affiant aforesaid further states that the reason assigned by the paymaster aforesaid for not paying him from the date of his appointment was that he could only pay from the day when Company roll contained a minimum number of names, and that this minimum ^{first} appeared to have been enrolled upon the 5th day of August, 1862.

And the said affiant states that he makes this claim to obtain the arrears of pay justly due him for services rendered as set forth in the foregoing declaration and the documents forwarded herewith.
