My Darling Wife; - You see I am away in another part of the great Keystone State, from that in which I addressed you last. I came on here from Erie on the 18th spoke here on the 14th & 15th insts; and am to spend in the neighboring counties for the next few days. I am much rested and am recovering fast from the slight oppression which rested on me a few days since. I have to speak almost every day and would not stop if I could. I know I am doing good for the great cause - I have been very anxious for you and father mother and Willie - I know you are in great difficulty - I would send you some money to come North now but I want to wait till I am in Phila. again and send at the same time a travelling dress for you and some clothes for James. You may look for its very soon after receiving this. I am very anxious that you should come just as soon as you can for your situation troubles me terribly. If you are able to come

When you receive this, and have not
heard of the money, telegraph me at No-
1105 Chestnut St Phila - care Col Frank
Jordan - and I will send an at once -
I shall probably send you a check which
you must take down to Kellogg Breunigen & Co
and get cashed yourself - Before you leave
have James take the books out of the case
in our room and put them in the tin-
lined box which used to be in the hall
and leave it up at Frutkin's. Let him do it
on the sly - and make no words about the
matter - Nail down the windows of our
room, and leave the key with Liz, and
tell her to let no one else in it. I will
send money enough so that you can leave a
sum large enough to make our folks com-
fortable while we are away. When you come
to Phila - If I am not there send a request
at once to Col. Jordan No. 1105 Chestnut St
that he will telegraph me, I will then come
to you or he will let you know where I
am and you can come to me. James
will have to get some shoes and fixing them. You
must look after him - I do not expect to
hear from you again until you telegraph
me that you are coming. I shall endeavor

or to come to Phila - and you
cher darling - I wish you could be
now. I am at such a cozy nest here
among the hills of Allegany - at the house
of a brother of the Hon. S. A. Brown, for-
merly speaker of the House of Reps. You
he is an old Pei W brother and his
brother's family are so kind and
They are very anxious you should come
and visit them. They have formed a
great liking for me and I am com-
pletely domesticated in their lovely home.
They all send you sympathy and greetings
as to a loved sister. And Oh Darling
I want you so badly - Do come
soon as you get the money. I do
so wish you could sleep in my arms
tonight - Are you getting well fast?
Do, Darling and come to me. Bring every
thing you will want for a long stay with you
not forgetting what you will need with the
night of your arrival - Entending any?
Mr. Manning of Mass. is my fellow visitor
and is very pleasant company indeed.
Tell James I saw his sister the other day
and told her that he should come to
soon as soon as you give me word.

I am sent for all over the
State and must go everywhere
I can. I may not be able to
send you a ~~travelling~~ dress for
I don't know what you want.
Could you come on to
Phila - and get one there. You know
I can't tell what is fit? Perhaps
you had better -
