Judge A. W. Furgur:

Sir: I beg leave to tell you that I have never used your name in connection with F. B. Keogh, for Congress this Fall, I think you are rather harsh in your letter, especially to a man that has worked as hard as I have for your political interest.

I think I have noticed a coolness on your part ever since the nominating convention at High Point, some of my friends thought that I ought to have nominated you, ^{any how} but I thought you were too intelligent to believe that I could nominate you over 11 Counties. I gave you my vote and influence which was all that I could do.

I have remarked on several occasions that in case Mr Lash did not accept Mr Keogh was my choice next. I was told that Henderson and Keogh were in the field, and of the two I preferred Keogh.

The petition that you are making such a fuss over, that it signed for Lindsay I explained to you at the time, and told you, that we did not expect it.

To accomplish anything, it was only
to create a good feeling between our people
here, we were well aware that the office
was already filled with another man.
