Nov. 19th 1868

My Dear Wife:

I arrived here last night after a very tedious trip from Morrisville, about one o'clock last night. Before morning I had a very severe attack of diarrhea which has not yet left me. I feel perfectly well and think it must have been the result of some poisonous substance eaten or drunk yesterday.

I have been in Court all day and have had a very pleasant time. The docket is not large but I do not see how I can get away from here before Tuesday morning. If it were possible I might go to Morrisville on Saturday but do not think I can. Somehow I feel rather tired tonight. I will

perhaps add a line to this in the morning and let you know how I am getting along. You must not think I am sick for I am not in the least. I managed to make a charge to a certain extent satisfactory to my own mind. Much more so, than any I have made since I left Rockingham. I am having good order too and in fact, have every prospect of a pleas-ant court -

Friday Morning

There is no prospect of my getting away from here today or tomorrow, I may come Monday or Tuesday -
