Court's (4) decision to the Supreme Court,

Section of the New Code of Procedure

Court at Fall Term 1868, to the Supreme
Court should be governed by the old law.

them to yourself or not at your discretion.
Please look over the papers, & if they, transcript

the Supreme Court. If you discover any
error that we have overlooked, please return

have it corrected, and forward again, We of
course expect you to attend to the case for us
in the Supreme Court, & we will satisfy you
for your trouble at first sight.
