

Greensboro N.C.

Sept. 13th 1875

My Darling Wife:

It is getting well into the night and I ought to be getting to bed but I cannot write you a few lines, just to let you know that I do not forget you entirely. I have been on the wing all the time since I wrote you and have spoken every day except Sunday. I get along very well but I find that I have right enough of the old poor white cowardice and shamefacedness about me. I think every one but me is quite discouraged by the Maine election. Somehow, it does not disturb me so much now. I cannot help a vague notion that it will help me. I go to Zaneesville in the morning and shall return tomorrow night. I will write you a good long letter on

and would like it all my life -

The idea of Lottie's sitting with a
colored girl I am surprised at her doing
so. I have been afraid she was getting
demoralized on that head. The first

but I might as well ask the Sphinx
