My dear wife:

I have been working all day to try and wrangle matters so that I can leave next week. I am afraid I cannot do it. The cases will be set up by about the middle of next week. Then, I must have the index ready to go right on with. It will take all of next week to do this, I think. I have got Magnien to help me out. I am so impatient that I cannot dally with it any longer. So far as I can see, this will keep me here until after Chatham week. I do not know but this is quite as well; for then I shall know, pretty well, whether I want to come back or not. I will try and send you some more money this week and you can arrange to go to Canada, &c, just as if it was such a factor in your plans. It is a sore

disappointment and I may yet conclude  
to come, anyhow. You must not expect me  
any and then you will not be disappoint-  
ed. The matter about a paper drugs and  
halls and I am very doubtful what will be done  
I shall very soon give the matter up and  
turn my attention solely to other matters.  
I think the Digesh will pay for itself in 30  
days, which will leave a good margin  
afterwards. I am sure I hope so. I want to  
put out one or two more books this summer  
and then I don't care what else is done  
here - Politically, things are getting very much  
unpleasant. I don't know how they will pan  
out. You must be off good cheer,  
I have not time to write much  
as I must go to work
