Jan. 19th 1886.

My dear wife: I reached her an hour ago, have got me a new pair of glasses, having lost the pair I brought from home last night, got my mail, my express parcels, unpacked my trunk passed on the proof of the second sheet of poster, telegraphed to Severance and am now ready to go to work after writing to you. Had a pleasant audience and a pleasant time last night. The Young People's Musical and Literary Society, had had a "Tournee Night" the week before and had read selections from my works. "Lilly's Rush" Dialogue between Gurney and Bureson, "Betty Certain," "John Brown" and Lincoln from H.P. — I was going to read for them the "Old Unioner" but did not have it with me.

I met Dr Ely in at Drunfields, Both inquired cordially after you — I saw Dr Ely brother — also a doctor who died —

I am very comfortably quartered here and feel like doing a

good bit of work. You should not have gone to clearing up when tired and worried - Please take things a little more ~~slow~~ slowly and do not try to do everything at once.

It was very kind of you to send the introduction by Rev. Wright - It is too good to think of improving. I will fix it up and use it.

I send you \$2.50 - and for once will be fool enough to enclose it so that if it should be lost you will have the laugh on me as bad as well could be - will write to Alacum -
