When I published this volume
in 1872, I was unable to trace
your line in Canada later down
than Joseph your grandfather.
Since then I have obtained
much material from Canada.
But back of your grandfather
your family history is complete
to the first settler, George,¹⁶³⁸

who was the son of John Curwen
of Northampton, England, born
about 1580. The work also gives
a condensation of the history of
the English family, which is taken
from Camden's Britannia, & Hutchin-
son's Hist. of Cumberland Co., Eng.

I am anticipating a visit to the
ancestral seat this summer,
starting in the latter part of
May, and hope to find some
additional facts, although I go for
rest!

Are you acquainted with Curwen's
Journal and Letters, 1775-84, four vols.
of which have been published? The
author was a loyalist, and gives the
best view, (according to Dickens), of
English life, during our Revolutionary
struggle, extent.

I have never had the privilege of
hearing your husband's address, but
always notice his name with pleasure.
