Gentlemen:

I send today all the copy except the final sheet of Button Inn. That will come in Friday.

We have not had any galley-proof for some time and I have half now my page-proof for two weeks.

Edgar Torrey will soon be engaged to do the proof-reading of the type, of which he has charge, and if it is expected to have the book out this summer, he should have all the proof done soon.

I am unable to get any definite answer from the Lithographers as to how many copies they are likely to want. They say they hope to sell 10,000, which is not a satisfactory basis for an edition. As soon as I can have the proof-sheets complete, I will go to the printer and make definite arrangements. They are very friendly and seem anxious to do all they can.

We were unable to get any satisfactory photograph of the Inn and the artist who made the drawing of the light house at Barcelona is abroad and we could not learn her address.
