his store of "things not said" and
make titles to the Chapters. His
titles are always provocative of in-
terest, & by no means perfunctory.
That will enable us to spread out
a little in proof. If he would also
pump up a two page preface it would
help along! Ask him to send the
titles for the first four or five Chap-
ters immediately, so that we can
work them in on the new pages; the
others can be inserted in each
chapter as it comes to him in
