Dear Sir:

Yours of 3rd inst. was received and forwarded to S. M. Lindsley, Esq., Supreme Regent of the Royal Arcanum, at Utica, N. Y. The Supreme Regent, in view of the fact that you appear to be so very technical, directs me to notify you that your application, which you signed, binds you to all the provisions of our laws, and that if you signed without knowing what those provisions were, it was your own fault in not investigating, and that you are bound all the same. He directs that you must be examined ~~again~~ again, and if you do not conform to the rule you will not be acknowledged as a member of the Order, and your Council will be instructed not to receive your assessments or dues.

The Supreme Regent suggests that if you comply with this simple regulation, upon due application from the Council he may issue a dispensation legalizing your admission, as he has power to do upon cause shown.
