The clipping enclosed is from the "Fla. Standard" of Nov. 15th 90 and relates to a case which two of us worked to the "Queen's taste". Don't imagine however that I'm fond of such work, for there is plenty to do that is more to my liking. My six months probation was up on Nov. 7th and a few days

Since I received my permanent appointment at \$1600⁰⁰ per year and \$4⁰⁰ per day for traveling expenses — the temporary appointment was for \$1200⁰⁰ per year and \$4⁰⁰ per day.

Have been reasonably successful; and need not tell you how grateful I am for your assistance rendered at the critical time. Have moved Mrs P and the "little gal" to Chattanooga but we are likely to board for some time to come as I am not here much of the time and there would be little use of keeping house.
