Yours of the 17th. inst. enclosing line received by you from our Mayville office is received.

The accounts referred to are the two copyright accounts, "Letters to a King", and "With Guage and Swallow." The amount advanced upon the assignment of the contract of "Letters to a King" has not been fully repaid, and there is still a balance due as shown by Mr. Cipperly's statement of \$81.12. I presume the amount now coming from that contract is very small, and not sufficient to pay the balance due, and as it has been standing a long time, the suggestion is made that it be paid in some other way.

For "Guage and Swallow" I advanced \$100, which has been reduced to \$13.90; I presume the returns yet to be received from this book will more than ~~cover~~<sup>is</sup> this balance, but it is so small that Mr. Cipperly thought best to include it with the other. We hold assignments of the "Advance" and the "Ledger" contracts, but nothing has been received by us on those accounts. I shall be glad to give you more full information if you desire.

I hope the Judge is improving in health, and able to do the work which usually devolves upon him at this time of the year.
