Dear Sir: In explanation of
my Telegram today allow me to
say, that I cannot give you a written
speech. I do not write speeches because
my brain is too weak to memorize one and
my eyesight too poor to read one: but I
have been thinking for some time that
I would say something about "The
New Trinity" about this time. If you
announce the subject let that be all
that is said about it. From your in-
formation I will say that the "New
Trinity," is "A Protected Citizenship,
Protected Labor Substratum and a
Protected Currency." The speech
will be an attempt to trace the
essential unity and absolute
inseparability of these ideas, or
in other words, the national
relation to citizenship, labor and

currency, and the ^{mutual} obligation
to protect them all and the de-
pendence of each upon the other.

I expect to arrive on
the 7.30 a.m. train Michigan
Central from Buffalo on
Monday and trust you will
catch me in a hole and
let me sleep the better
part of the day.
