

# Pay and Travel Pay yet due Officers.

MARIETTA, OHIO, *April 14* 1891

DEAR SIR:

A great many of the volunteer officers have unclaimed pay and travel pay due them for their service. An officer may have any or all of the following claims, according to the facts of his service, the place and cause of his discharge. If he began service before the 22. July 1861, and was promoted before serving two years, he is entitled to \$100 bounty. (Act April 22nd, 1872, as amended July 23d, 1888.) An enlisted man or officer, commissioned in a higher grade, is entitled to the higher grade pay, and has a claim for the DIFFERENCE OF PAY between the rank from which he was promoted and the rank to which he was promoted, from the date of his rank named in his commission to the date of his muster thereon: 1st, if he performed the duties of the higher grade, or 2nd, was a prisoner of war at the time, or 3d absent by reason of wounds, or 4th, in hospital by reason of disability; this under the act June 3d, 1884, as amended by the act of August 13, 1888. Claims for remuster and difference of pay range in amounts from \$50 to \$350 according to length of service under the commission before muster. This claim for remuster and difference of pay must be made and filed before June 3d, 1892. When an officer was mustered out, or discharged in the field and received his discharge or order of discharge, at any place but his home, and paid his own transportation home, he is entitled to TRAVEL PAY from the place where he received his discharge to his home, at the rate of one days pay and allowances, for each twenty miles of the distance travelled, provided he did not tender his resignation for personal reasons, or it was not accepted as a personal favor. Travel pay claims range from \$25 to \$300 according to rank and distance travelled. If entitled to either, and you have not filed a claim therefor, I should like to file the claim for you. *If you wish me to file them, please answer the questions on the enclosed sheet and mail it to me.* On the back of this sheet you will find a partial list of officers for whom I have secured remuster, travel pay, etc.
