Dear Mrs. Tourgee:-

Your letter was received yesterday and I will confer with Mr. Nixon about the matter. As I intimated to the Judge when he was here, there was a propriety in delaying the matter because Mr. Nixon in view of the sale of the controlling interest in the paper to Mr. Kohlsaet felt that all parties in interest should be consulted. I know that he is not indifferent in the matter but scores of things have come up for discussion and the details of the new adjustment have absorbed his attention. I can say, without discussing questions that properly fall to Mr. Nixon, that there has been no change in Mr. Nixon's attitude of appreciation and friendliness to the Judge, nor in his estimate of the value of the proposed story. I know that Mr. Nixon has been on the point of writing the Judge several times within the last week, but considerations of which he will write himself, have interfered with his plans. I am very sorry that anything has occurred to give you uneasiness and certainly will do all that I possibly can to bring about a decision.
