I have read with interest the "Bystander's notes" in the Inter Ocean. I have been living in this place the past several years, came here to seek a home in this beautiful climate, to spend the evening of my life, after a service of more than thirty years as a Christian Missionary on the West Coast of Africa. I enclose a slip cut from the "Salatha Weekly Times". It is one among the many such cases that are taking place all over the South. Since I have been living here, a colored man who had worked for a prominent citizen, received one order for his payment

The Colored man, while he was a
consistent Christian, could not
read the paper, and carried it to a
white man who read it to him "Steve
pay this Coon eight dollars for work
and cheat him all you can" The
Christian black man took it without
repentment. My heart is pained by
what I am obliged to see from day
to day, of the treatment that the Colored
people receive, and of am spoken of
as the old man who loves the "Niggers"
too much. There is much in the Colored
people that is objectionable, but they are
just what American Civilization
has made them, and our country has
a great weight of guilt resting upon us
that must bring the judgment of
Heaven, unless it is repented of and
put away. Please excuse this intru-
sion. I don't wish my name to offend.
