Dear Sir.

I unrate you two weeks ago today in closing a measure, strap and instructions for taking your own measure as the one sent me was so much out of proportion that I can not believe it correct. I am coming to the conclusion that the presence of the strap might have caused some curious letter handler to make me with it. So will send another instruction sheet, and blank for measure. I saw the measure sent me you were to show if correct send me the dimensions of the foot right and in inches with any tape.

Beginning at the ball line as
indicated on diagram and
and set the measure in order.
The last measure No 6 must be
taken 8 inches up the ankle
about as tight as you would like
the fit in leg. All the other
places taken moderately tight
while the right foot being
easy over left leg. I would
like the measure as soon as
can get it that I may get the
shoes to you by Christmas.
In addition to what you have
told me about how to
make them. Tell whether you
have preference to stock in
uppers; style of Last or Toe.
Tell where you want the sole
cut first also the Heel. This
is a copy of the measure
sent me $5\frac{1}{2}$ - $8\frac{1}{2}$ - $9\frac{1}{2}$ - $13\frac{1}{4}$ - 9.
The $5\frac{1}{2}$ I believe correct. ³ ⁴ ⁵
But the ball is either too little or
instep & too much, 1 inch
difference between low & high
instep can hardly be true.
If you have a card locate it
to me, If you take the measure
loose in one place take
it so in all cases but to
make a comfortable shoe
the measure must be taken
moderately tight every where
and tell me so. Stating the
tender places. Then I can make
alaminus.
