This consignment will be reached and sold *Wednesday, October 31st, 1894*. Everyone of the twelve head consigned is a good individual and choicely bred, and are only offered in order to reduce our number for the Winter. Some of these yearlings, two years old and three years old are as promising as ever were bred at the Great Meadow Farm, and will prove to be grand investments to who ever buys them.

Our object in bringing this sale to your attention is, that if the animals are to be virtually given away, we prefer that our friends and patrons should secure the bargains. *Every animal will be sold to the highest bidder*, and if they fall into hands of those who will develop them, we will reap our reward later on, on account of their performances. Most of the lot are by *Meander* the sire of Pamlico 2.10, one of the very greatest race horses that ever lived and who has beaten about everything but Alix. Pancoast, sire of Patronage, the sire of Alix 2.03 $\frac{3}{4}$, as well as Attorney the sire of the dam of Alix were both owned and sold from the Great Meadow Farm. Bona Fide has put three new ones in the 2.30 list this year, best one Shillaly, 2.21 $\frac{1}{4}$, and the Guy Wilkes family have been in the fore front, and with such performers as Hulda 2.08 $\frac{1}{2}$, Mula Wilkes 2.11, Hazel Wilkes 2.11 $\frac{1}{4}$, Lesa Wilkes 2.11 $\frac{1}{2}$, Royal Wilkes 2.11 $\frac{3}{4}$ and Mary Best 2.12 $\frac{1}{4}$, an unparalleled showing and which attracts attention to the get of Californian offered in this consignment.

He unites the blood of Pamlico, 2.10, with that of Kremlin, 2.07¾, and Belle Vara, 2.08¾.

FUSINA is large and well made, and is full sister to Nadjy, 2.33, who took a prize at the National Horse Show of 1892, and has trotted in 2.20½. She is well broken to harness and can show better than a three minute gait. This mare is a prize; her road qualities are first-class, and she will trot as fast as her sister Nadjy.

MAID OF RACINE was a trotter of undoubted speed and courage. She was never systematically trained for the track but is a model road mare. Had she been trained and raced she would undoubtedly have taken a record that would have placed her in the free-for-all class of her day. She was driven on the road the season of 1892, and carried BERAND much better than a 2.30 gait. BERAND is a dark bay, almost brown, and is an exceptionally fine looking, good gaited colt, with an intelligent head and eye. He inherits great speed and is a first-class yearling.
