COMRADE:-

On the eve of honorable and distinguished graduation at Oberlin College, Ohio, H. H. Cumings closed his text books, and abandoned his studies; his habiliments of the Senior Class were supplanted by the blue uniform of the Union soldier, and when commencement day came his degrees were conferred, and this young student enjoyed the pleasures of graduation as he stood in line of battle near Lexington, Kentucky.

Three months after enlistment he was detached from his regiment and assigned to duty as First Lieutenant of Parson's Battery which was practically destroyed at the battle of Perryville, fifty per cent. of the men being killed and wounded. He was then assigned to duty on the staff of Col. A. S. Hall, Commanding Brigade, and soon after on that of Brig. Gen. E. H. Hobson. Returning to his regiment, March 1863, he participated in every campaign, skirmish and battle in which it was engaged.

He was promoted to Captain after Missionary Ridge and assigned to Company K (105th Ohio Volunteers), which he commanded thereafter until mustered out June 3rd, 1865, when Pennsylvania's fertile fields gave him a welcome, and since then, his home, his social and business relations, and his every association have been in the Keystone State.

Actively engaged in commercial pursuits of great magnitude, he has ever found the time to devote to the interests of our Comrades and of our organization; he has filled varied stations with marked ability, has attended National and Department Encampments with regularity, and when a representative to either, has always been found in his place attending to the duties for which he was elected.

His enviable soldier record and honorable business career, with his unswerving adherence to the principles, fraternities and comradeship of the Grand Army of the Republic, combined with his comprehensive intelligence and general qualifications, enable us to cordially and unhesitatingly commend Comrade H. H. Cumings to your generous consideration, and we know that under his guidance the Department of Pennsylvania would lose not a leaf of its well-earned laurels.
