Dear Sir

Your circular anno-  
nouncement of the "Basis" is at hand,  
but I have been unable to come  
to any settled conclusion as to its  
being advisable for me to give  
my aid and influence, however small  
they may be, to such a project.

Never was I so perplexed as to con-  
ditions and nonplus'd, as to men  
and the party I have honored and  
supported. Perhaps I ought to say that  
nothing has astounded or hurt me  
more than the fact of your favor-  
ing such a compromise with the  
devil, shall I say of wicked pro-  
vidence, where most hateful, as to "parties"  
as most so in so called Christian re-  
ligions of all religions or faiths.  
As it is "not lawful" to do evil" to pro-

-mote God's cause, in any aspect of it, by any resort to or compromise with evil I cannot follow any denomination, party or leader who lowers or favors lowering the glorious banner of God's truth and exact justice to all men, in general, but especially to all our own citizens and most so as to such in our own party.

I have repeatedly affirmed that if the people who hate & despise the Negroes and others like them and for similar reasons are or were going to be in heaven itself, with such a disposition towards any others as causlessly and abominably I would not voluntarily go to or stay in heaven; as to be with such people would be a hell to me.

I might, religiously, perhaps find an earthly home with the "Old" Baptists but for the same monstrous thing, along with some of even their ecclesiasticism.

Your circular says nothing as to what course the "Basis" will take politically. Because of the abominable "southernizing," &c., so the popularizing of the Republican party I am in doubt of my own ability to support it though I know not where else to turn, only to turn away from supporting, aiding evil, in chief things, I cannot feel free to commit myself to a positive course either for or against my old party, love nor for the starting of such a periodical until I know whether it is to be the organ of any party or man or be truly independent and inflexibly in favor of exact justice to all men & citizens & opposed to any & all compromises with the opposites. It becomes ever plainer, to me, that it is not so much instruction that is needed, on justice and citizenship, as it is for the <sup>feast</sup> of <sup>god</sup> love of

justice and true republican government. The men or people of this Country know as well as do any on earth what is right, or better; but like others, they harden their hearts and boldly refuse to give to others, to the weak, what they have and claim for themselves.

Nothing is more desirable to me than to aid to almost every move-  
ment that is in line with God's truth and that further of his which is without respect of persons and my attitude as to the "Basis" will be according to its own course for it is likely to be. Regretting not to be able to do differently at present I am
