Dear Judge: --

I send you under separate cover the balance of the proofs of the Tables of the "Story" with the exception of Tables IX,X and XI. I enclose the copy for these as do not think it best to wait to put the in type, and as soon as you have furnished about 100 or so pages of the long primer they can be returned and we can then get them up in type or they can be left until the last thing as they will go in the last form of the book. The reason we did not set them up was because we would have to wait for type to come back from the electrotypers, and thought that we had better not delay another minute.

We can put up from twenty to forty pages a day of the long primer so that if the proofs are not bad I dont think we will have any trouble in getting it out in time.

We send you by freight to-day fifty copies of each number of the BASIS with the exception of the last two numbers of which there were not that number left out of the 1500. We send what were left. We also have enclosed in the box the envelopes which you wanted.

We will have finished by to-morrow the counting of the BASIS, and will then let you know how many there are.
