Dear Judge:--

Your letter of the 29th is just at hand. In regard to ten copies of the BASIS to be sent to Mr. Martinet I would say that I do these special copies up myself and send them to the post-office. I have sent him copies of each issue as the wrappers have come up here, with the exception of week before last when there were not enough left if we would save any copies over at all, and so I sent him some more copies of the week before. With this exception he has had mailed to him each issue.

July 21 you ordered 200 copies sent to Hon. Frank M. Thurman, Jackson, Mich., and wanted him to have them by the 25th inst. On July 23d I addressed two packages of 100 each to him and had them sent at once to the postoffice. If he has not received them we should know it so as to notify the post-office at once, as the mail from this office is going out regularly and promptly.

Mr. C. M. Fenton, 542 Linwood Ave., this city, was one of the first subscribers to the BASIS, but he says he does not get the paper and I cannot find his name among the wrappers which are here for this week.
