I believe that I get out the paper as expeditiously as it can be done. The last o of the copy is received on Tuesday and on Wednesday morning I have it ready for the press. You understand that none of the pages can be made up, with the exception of the Good Government, until the last of the copy comes in and is set up. Every Tuesday night I stay here with two men to make up the pages and read them so that there may be no delay. It is impossible to, in one day, print both forms, fold, stitch, trim and mail the papers, if it is to be done in a satisfactory manner, and not have the pages, particularly the cut pages, offest. If it was newspaper work it would be a little different.

If we can have all of the copy by Monday we can work on Monday night and gain a day.
