Referring to your letter of the 18th instant, received today, in which you request a copy of the record, recommendation or
order by which W. H. Castle, 105th Ohio Infantry Volunteers, was
dismissed the service, I am directed by the Secretary of War to
inform you that the records show that upon the recommendation of
Lieutenant-colonel George Perkins, commending the 105th Ohio Volunteers, concurred in by his superior officers - including Brigadier-General Absalam Baird, Brevet-Major General Jeff. C. Davis,
and Major Generals W.T.Sherman and H. W. Halleck - 1st Lieutenant
William H. Castle, Company E, 105th Ohio Volunteers, was dishonorably dismissed the service, in special orders No.15, paragraph 56,
War Department, Adjutant General's Office, dated January 10, 1865,
for desertion.

The papers in his case are voluminous, but copies of them, together with a full statement of his record, were furnished to the
Chairman of the Committee on Military Affairs, House of Representatives, 53d Congress, 2d Session, August 1, 1894, and it is suggested

that if their text is essential to your purpose: the files of the Committee be consulted.
