Dear Wife -

I don't know why I have not written to you more frequently of late. I have been in almost daily receipt of letters from "Wife", but have not written one in a long time. In fact I have not written to any one for a brief age. I know and the doctors opor my health so that I have done nothing but sit in my tent read and write. There has been an other big battle here, and it has resulted in a most glorious victory for us. I was not considered sufficiently strong to try the pursuit and was consequently left in

Command of the camp, a duty
which I could perform just
as well as a man of robust
health. It was undoubtedly best
that it should have been so but
I do not like to stay in camp
while the regiment is fighting.
It galls me much. I wish
I had not been made so sensitive.

Boug's army however is
completely wiped out. In fact
I am not sure but we shall get
him and it both before the race is
over.

Our regiment has suffer-
ed but little and killed a company
of Co D and nine wounded,
most of them slightly.

I can't
write even now. I am
very much better. I shall
stay here, until I am well
or dead.

I shall go on duty a-
gain as soon as I
am on the right
