My Dear Wife:

I am writing in sight of a crowd of nearly 10000 persons collected in mass meeting here tonight. I never saw such a crowd before. Oh! this is a hearty city and you may be sure we poor Southern devils appreciate its hospitality and heartiness. We have had a hearty and hot time in Convention today. I do not know that I ever saw a more lively meeting anywhere than the session of today. The question of impartial suffrage came up and drew a tremendous fire of — not debate but fear —

liamentary dodging. I am on the  
Committee on the <sup>Revision</sup> Reconstructed  
States and have to finish the report  
tonight.

I am very anxious to hear  
from you my first work every  
day is to go to the Club room and  
League rooms, after a letter and  
then to the post office. I cannot  
see why I do not hear from  
you I have heard from Hodgkin  
since I left. Have you got the  
papers and notes I have sent?  
I have sent one or both every day  
since I came here.

Still they come - I wonder  
how many people there are in Phila -  
I never saw so many. There seems to  
be no end to the processions which  
are rolling in toward the League  
house. I do hope you are well  
I am going through the State speak-  
ings. I shall be in Erie on the

12 inst and afterwards in one  
place and another till the 25th  
when I shall be in Pottsville  
at the Soldiers & Sailors Union
