Upon seeing this endorsement Mr. Harris  
said that was the money for which  
application had been made and that  
Mr. Munro, for whom he seemed  
to speak had never got a cent of the  
money paid. Before this I supposed that  
the claim for commutation of ra-  
tios was the <sup>only</sup> claim Mr. ~~Munro~~  
Harris, Mr. Harris at once requested me  
to ascertain to whom the money had been  
paid. I wrote and was informed by Col  
Taylor the Paymaster, that the money was  
paid to R. L. Pettengill attorney of Jacob  
Munro on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of August  
A. D. 1866.

Now, Sir, you will perceive from these  
facts that at the time the payment was made  
I was absolutely ignorant of the existence of any  
such person as J. Munro, and that it  
was by the merest chance that I finally  
learned the nature and extent of his  
claim. I ~~did not know that any~~ claim  
whatever, had been paid to him or his attorney  
until about the 10<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> of December
