Yours of the 28th July
came to hand yesterday, Was pleased to learn
that you were well and that your State matters
were in so healthy condition, My prayer is
that justice and peace shall prevail and all
enjoy equal rights under the Law.

I herewith send blank leaf from my Civil
Docket - showing in full the entries we make
(in blank) I would say that once in 10 or 12
pages we leave a blank page so as to enter
cases that require a larger space for the record
than is required in common ones, Our Docket
has an alphabet our laws requiring each
case to be indexed and entered on the alphabet
showing the page & so, My Criminal Docket
is a very simple affair not much more than
a common blank Book, Were I to get one
up I think with a little alteration in the Civil
a good Criminal Docket could be made,
Hoping that what I send will be satisfactory but if
