

Hillsboro N.C., Nov. 10th 1868

My dear wife:

I am fearful that you have been much troubled by lack of funds. The draft, - strangely enough - came to me here today. I did not get it until this evening and the letter of transmittal was dated today. I send it to you at once already enclosed, by doctor Livingston. Please explain, if need be, to Tom the reason of the delay.

Court is going on finely. I shall be up on Friday night I think unless I go to Raleigh. I have put off the Chatham Court until Thursday and shall go to the meeting of the Board of Trustees at Raleigh on Tuesday.

I will try and get the omnibus

before I come up. You may look
for it by express as soon as Friday at
the least.
