Sir By the Request
of Mr Charles Albright. I write you
afew lines stating the facts of a case before
me the said Charles has sworn the peace
against Parish Kirkpatrick and being found
guilty of a malicious crime I thought it proper
to bind him in a sum of five hundred
Dollars with good security for his peace and
good behavior and to appear at the next court
to answer the charge against him now he
the said Parish by the advice of Mr Scott
wants the Bond reduced so that he may
be able to give security which I refuse to do
for he has further said so I am told by
good authority that all he wanted was a chance
at her and so he has implored Mr Scott
to intercede for him Mr Albright desires me
to make this statement to you for your
consideration
