Now we will make these markers for you at five dollars each and if you prefer to have them just a little larger we will make them so at the same price.

While these markers are small they are very hard to cut in granite and are well worth more money but as we are making you a nice monument we certainly want to please you with the markers as well.

If this is satisfactory kindly let us know the initials you want placed on each and also if you would care to have them made an inch or two larger. We enclose you a copy of the contract as you request and trust you will find it very satisfactory.
