Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your favor of the 12th inst, with enclosure.

You can make the markers as indicated at \$5.00 each. I enclose the initials to be put on the top--and dates on the outside. This, I understand is included in the price named. While we do not wish these markers to be at all conspicuous, if it is necessary to make them a little larger than the dimensions sent to Mr Frick, we do not object.

I do not find the inscription asked for by Mr Frick in his letter to me of February 14th which he says was necessary to be placed on the contract--and which I sent him in type-written form on the 18th of February--included in the copy of contract sent me. As I understand this to have been a part of the contract, I return the one enclosed for this to be added to it.

I make a suggestion which may not have occurred to Mr Frick--that the monument be unloaded at what is known as "The Junction" which is only a short distance from the cemetery, whereas, should it be taken on to the Mayville, depot, it would make necessary a haul of more than a mile, and up a steep hill, which in such a great weight is a matter to be considered. I speak of this as something to your advantage to think about--if you so desire.

As all arrangements for the dedication of the monument on May 30th are being made, I trust that there will be no failure on your part to prevent our plans being carried out.
