Dear Madam:-

Pardon me for troubling you with another letter but I see a chance for a possible mistake in the lettering of the monument. The typewritten copy which you send is just a little indistinct and I am not sure whether Mr. Tourgée was born May 2nd or May 20th. Kindly let me know at once that there be no possible mistake.

Your letters have spoken of your wishing to unveil the monument on May 30th. I presume, of course, you realize that it might be impossible for us to time the freights so as to get there just to a day. You see if we depend on getting there, say May 29th, we might not in the slowness of the freight trains and be a few days late. On the contrary if we plan to have the work there, say by the 20th and then you didn't want it set until the 29th we would have to pay for the detention of the car.

I suppose, therefore, that there would be no objection on your part to our setting the monument any time in May and then the services could be held any day on which you chose to have them.

Kindly make this as plain to me as possible as I want to do, as nearly as possible, precisely as you want to have me in the matter of completing this work.
