We are in receipt of your esteemed favor of the 18th., enclosing your check of \$5.50 to cover the purchase price of stock which you desire us to ship this spring to your Mr. F. M. Waite at Mayville, Chautauqua County, New York, which order we shall very gladly fill and in a manner which we trust will be found entirely satisfactory.

We regret that you are not able to use the Asparagus and Rhubarb plants this spring, but they will do just as well planted in the Fall of the year, though you will of course, lose the benefit of this summer's growth. When you are ready to order them we will be very glad to give your man full and thorough instructions as to how to prepare the bed for Asparagus.

With your permission we will make this shipment by express rather than by freight. It will go through more promptly and we think reach you in better condition and the express charges will be very light. We cannot say at present just what they will amount to, but can advise you at some future time after shipment has been made.
