I beg to acknowledge receipt of your favor of recent date, and, in reply, would say that I am of the opinion that, in case Rosetta Tourgee dies intestate, you would be her heir as to all personal property.

with reference to the seven acres of land, its descent would be determined by the line from which it came, that is to say, that, if it came to Rosetta Tourgee from Norris, it would probably descend to the Norris heirs, as ancestral property. If it came to Rosetta Tourgee from the Tourgee line, it would descend to the Tourgee heirs, and you seem to be the only one coming under that head.
