Mr. Van Dorn promised to ship ^{it} that afternoon. On June 8 he sent
me the New York, Chicago and St. Louis R.Co. memorandum of ship-
ment of the urn that day. It has doubtless been in the railroad
freight house in Mayville a week or more. Strange they have not not-

has the ornamental attachments (two ^{large} side pieces to be screwed on),
and the reservoir; and write me at once as I am awaiting this in-

crate charges. I have sent your letter just received to Mr. Van
Dorn. That will wake him up if there has been any delay in the face
of his letter of June 8 with enclosure, showing the shipment that
day. As soon as the urn is in place, I would like a photo of the
Judge's resting place, showing not only the monument but also the
seat and two urns, gifts of Afro-Americans. From this photo, I will
have made a cut (though expensive) for use in publishing a portrait
of the same in The Gazette.
