Your letter of Oct. 10 is at hand. We regret that our estimate is too high, but a large part of the expense is due to the fact that you want only a small edition printed, and also to the cost of binding. It is very difficult to make books cheap if only five hundred copies are printed and bound.

We do not remember any proposition to purchase the plates for \$50.00, which of course cost a great deal more; but we presume you are correct as to this. We would submit, however, the fact that some years have elapsed since that time, during which the plates have been stored and in which interest has accrued, and we think that a fair price for them now would be \$75.00. We shall be glad to hear from you as to this.
