Dear Mr Cipperly:

I make herewith a final request for some reply to my communication to the Telephone Company of January 9th, -now nearly a month ago--in relation to the building they have occupied as an office, belonging to me. If Mr Griswold is still absent and has been all the time since the letter was written, please so inform me without farther delay, if, as you say, he is the proper person to make a decision in the matter. The longer the delay, the more embarrassing it must be to the Telephone Company. As to any annoyance or loss it may be to me, I think they have fully shown that this does not enter into their calculations at all.

I have now an opportunity to rent and I must have the matter attended to without farther delay--a lock put on the front door--the doors of the closets put back and the building cleaned. The water closet was left in such a filthy condition that it is a disgrace to think of the building as having had human occupants. When we left the building--and presumably when the Telephone Company rented it--it contained a good stove and plenty of pipe. This has all been taken away and must be returned--or made good to me.
