Dear Madam:

I have to acknowledge receipt of your esteemed favor of the 7th inst. and on examining my files I regret to find that through an oversight the result of our investigation relative to the message from Buffalo, N.Y., November 19th, to Miss Aimée Tourgée was not reported to you on the completion of our further investigation concerning the matters which you kindly brought to my attention, and for this I offer you my apology.

I find on examination of the reports in the matter that this message was transmitted over our wires to Westfield. You will recollect that at that time there was no Western Union office at Mayville and the message was therefore transferred to the Postal Company, the manager of which at Mayville stated, when inquired of concerning the disposition of the message, that it was "delivered by telephone at 3.36 p.m. November 19th, 1907". If there still remains any question concerning the delivery of the message it can perhaps be best removed by taking the matter up with Manager J. J. Fetitt of the Postal Telegraph-Cable Company at Mayville, as our control over the message ceased at Westfield and the service on our lines was correctly performed.
