





N 1824. DEACON ELIJAH FAY, one of the pioneers of Chautauqua Co., N. Y., planted the first vineyard on the shore of Lake Erie on his farm, now within the limits of Brocton. In 1840, wine was first made from the product. In 1859, his grandson, Garret E. Ryckman, built the Original Cellars for the storage of wine in quantity; and these have been enlarged until now the cellars contain over two hundred thousand (200.000) gat-

Ions of the vintage of past years.

The situation, soil and climate of Brocton are favorable for the thorough ripening of the grapes—two important considerations for producing the best quality of wine.

The statistics show that the Chautaugua

grape belt of which Brocton is the centre now contains 25,324 acres of vineyard, the production of '93 being 48,872 tons or 3,200 carloads.

Mr. Ryckman's efforts have been to produce wines that will stand the test of a comparison with those not only of America, but of Europe as well, in respect to purity, bouquet, body and flavor. The result is shown in the gradual building up within thirty years, of a large trade, which is annually increasing, and wholly on the merits of the product, for he has availed himself of none of the devices ordinarily used to build up a fictitious

reputation for his wines.

4 ITEMS OF INTEREST.

I guarantee all of my Brocton Wines to be the pure juice of the grape.

All orders by mail will receive prompt attention.

As many of my wines are of different vintages, parties ordering from price list should be particular to mention the kind of wine wanted, also the year.

I recommend my Port Wines, especially for invalids and persons in delicate health.

My Dry Wines are a good appetizer, and will aid digestion if drank with the meals.

Pure brandy is distilled from the grape. Every gallon sold by me is guaranteed oure.

A pure wine is as much a natural beverage as tea or coffee. I sell only Pure Brocton Wines.
