Greensboro, Roxboro April 19, 1869.

My dear wife:

I have not yet begun the Court here, but arrived last night, very weary after an all-day's journey from Hillsboro, horrible roads and slow team. From every indication I shall be through by Saturday and home that night, perhaps sooner. I left Ellen safely at the Shops and put her in Conductor White's care for next Sat. night. Everything seems in good condition here, docket very light and I look for an easy time. The Hotel here has changed hands, with a material advantage in favor of the present proprietor. The old "fool" of the carts, has taken its flight, at least I judge so from not seeing him on the table. Thompson has not yet come over, having waited for me, I suppose. He will surely bless me extensively when he comes. The Sunday night's frock must have been a death-stroke to the fruit, and probably to your cabbages and other vegetables also. I don't know when the mail goes out and it is pretty near Court time. I will therefore close this and try my chances for sending it to

nevermore. I will write you again tomorrow
or soon after.
