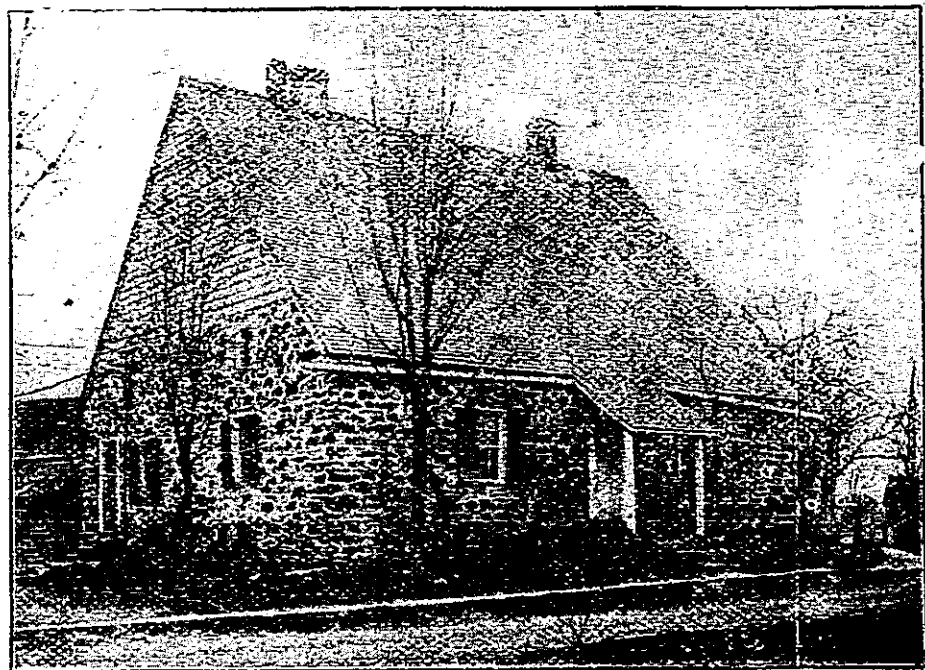

To the Descendants of the Huguenot Settlers of New Paltz.

For several years the work of raising funds for a suitable memorial to the Huguenot Patentees of New Paltz has been in progress.

The "Huguenot Patriotic, Historical and Monumental Association of New Paltz," organized for that purpose, has received contributions amounting to several thousand dollars. The Jean Hasbrouck house, one of the oldest and most interesting of the ancient stone houses on Huguenot St., has been purchased and the work of fitting it up as a museum of relics and documents of early days is going on.

The work of raising additional funds for a monument to the Patentees is meeting with good success. It is proposed to erect the monument directly across the street from the house, which has been purchased and adjoining the old graveyard and the site of the old French church.
