Complaint

The plaintiff alleges,

1. That on or about the 15<sup>th</sup> day of January 1863, J. N. Furb, endorsed to him for value, three bonds for the payment of money, each for the sum of \$100.66 <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> purporting to have been executed by Cornelia F. Fegleman, and Josephine E. Fegleman to him said Furb on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of November 1862 and bearing interest from that date, one of said bonds being payable on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of November 1863, one on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of November 1864, and the other on 2<sup>nd</sup> of November 1865,
  - 2<sup>nd</sup>. That on or about the 24<sup>th</sup> day of November 1864, Isaac N. Furb, departed this life intestate, that at August Term thereafter of Randolph County Court administration on his estate was granted to the defendant M. J. Reiter.
  - 3<sup>rd</sup>. That he has called on said defendant to pay off said bonds, endorsed as aforesaid, and that he has refused and declined to pay the same, or any part thereof.
  - 4<sup>th</sup>. That no part of the same has ever been paid.
- Therefore, the plaintiff demands judgment for \$425.00, with interest from 2<sup>nd</sup> day of November 1862, & the costs of this suit.
