I am very pleasantly located here at Mr. Hard's and have a large nice room and two beds all to myself - Yesterday made pretty good progress in disposing of the books - but the present indications I make for the spring term I had anticipated - probably an extraordinary one which I hardly think the capital case will be tried here - It is decidedly the worst county in the district - The juries are all the time an abominable element of them were - There is no crime can be committed by a white man - Yesterday three men were tried for cutting a colored man in pieces almost - stabbing and beating and mutilating in every possible manner - but it was all of no avail - "Not Guilty" was the verdict - It is no crime for a white man to cut a colored man open
