Dear Sir
I regret to have to inform you that
there was a great fire from the
best of my knowledge I have
got from you to see what you
discovered first all in white
and simple. over the fair
is now sent to the Sheriff

suit took out a Coleridge boy
that had bin comited for the
many years since and
his barns to them and
sent them a about a half
a mile from town on the
Hillboro road and call a
welder as one of the boys told
me to day and examine

I have been thinking of writing you for some time
 but have been so busy that I have not had time
 to do so. I am not
 at all well at present and
 I have been feeling
 as if I were in a
 feverish state of mind
 and I have been
 very much distressed
 at times of late. I
 will show you first to first
 out the matter and I will
 show it with the same care
 as I can get a few men to
 do it for me if it is
 necessary. I think it would
 be better to have more good
 men than to order out
 the militia and if you order
 me to investigate this matter
 I give you my word I will
 come to you if you have
 any more business you can
 be with me and my boys you have
 no time here.
