Dear Sir — I hope the Drafts I send
may suit you — or, at least, be sufficiently
suggestive to enable you to suit yourself with
a plan.

The rooms are rather larger than you sug-
gested; but none too large for comfort and
convenience.

What to do with the stairs? — is the un-
-mentioned question in planning a small house. —
They are generally so inconveniently arranged, and
made so steep and narrow, as to be a continual
torment. — In the accompanying plan, I have
done about the best I can; though an entirely
satisfactory arrangement cannot be made in
the limited space. In the bed room there is
tolerably good room for the bed under the stairs,
there being nearly 6 feet headway 6 feet from the
mouth wall. (It is, of course, intended for the
stairs to be enclosed, so as to communicate only with
the sitting room.)
