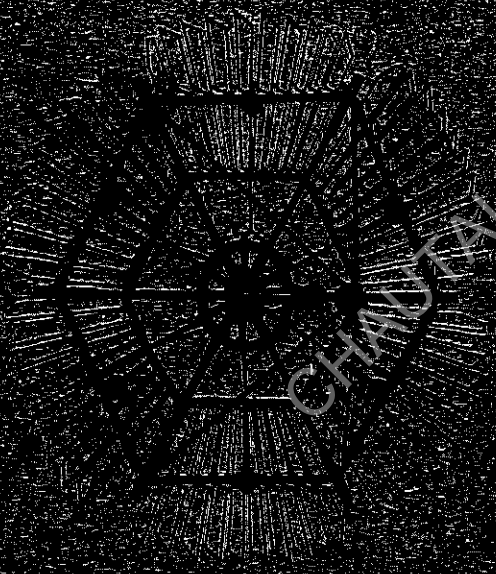
Dear Sir
